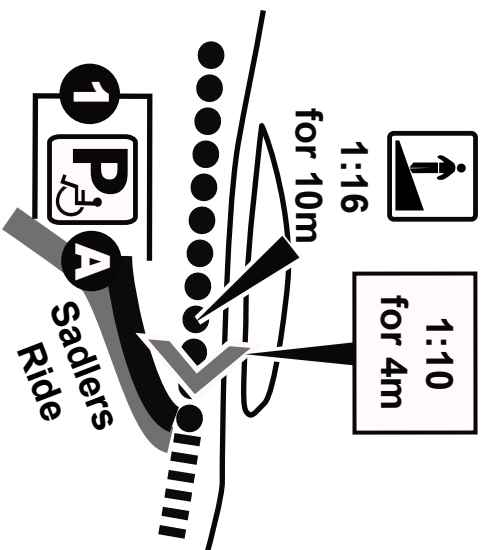


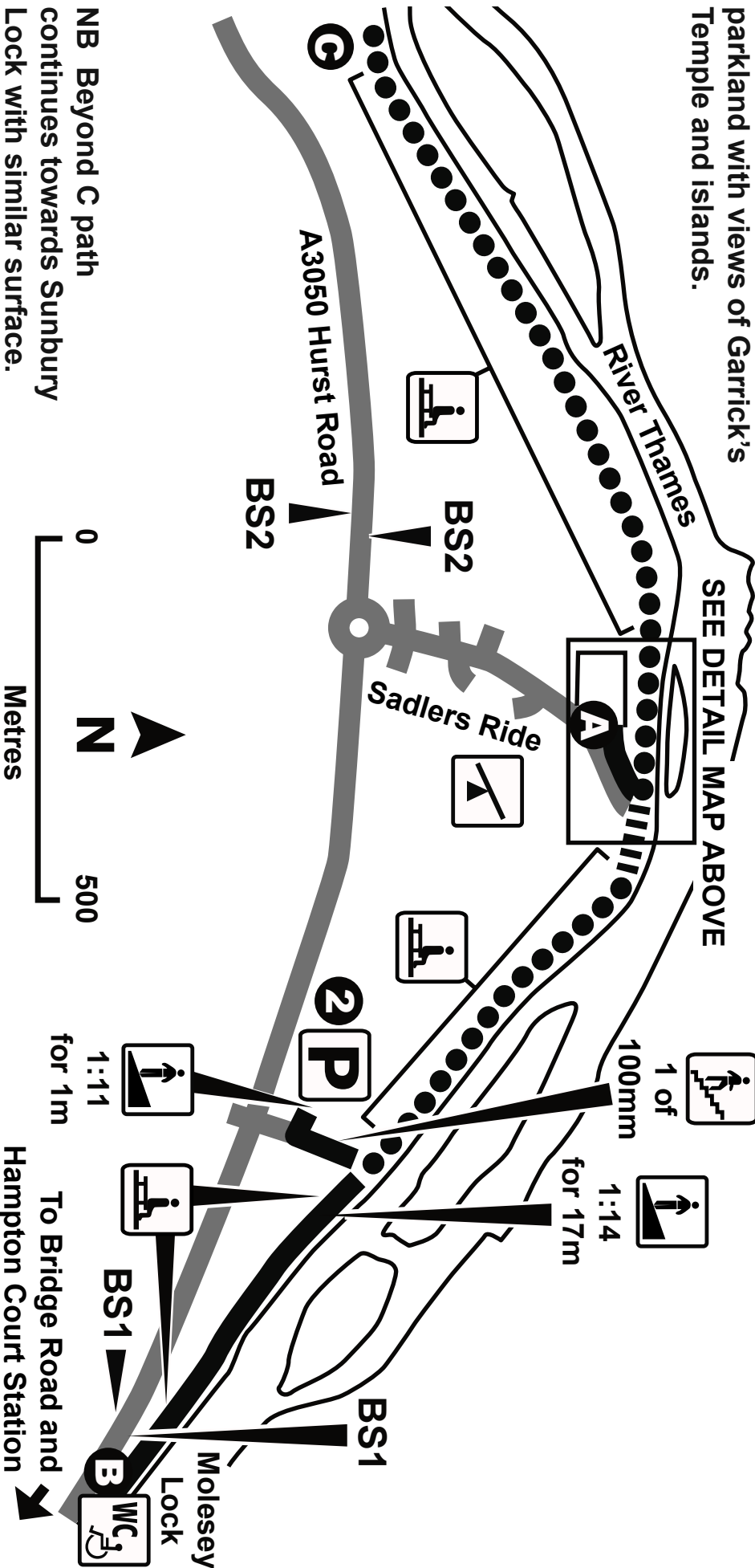
MOLESEY – HURST PARK

DISTANCE: 1.4 miles (2.3km) of riverside path
SLOPE: Maximum 1:10 (for 4m)
CROSS SLOPE: Maximum 1:14 (average 1:15 for 17m) on smooth tarmac
WIDTH: Minimum 1m, but mostly much wider

Pleasant paths along the banks of the River Thames through parkland with views of Garrick's Temple and islands.

NB Beyond C path continues towards Sunbury Lock with similar surface.

HOW TO GET TO MOLESEY – HURST PARK

MAP: OS Landranger 176, grid ref car park 1 TQ140692; car park 2 TQ146688

ROAD: Download free map from www.streetmap.co.uk - insert grid ref above as a Landranger and click search. Car Park 1 - follow signs for 'Riverside Open Space Parking', signed off A3050 1 mile west of Hampton Court Bridge. NB: Car park barrier locked at 9.00pm from 1 Apr to 31 Oct, and 4.30pm from 1 Nov to 31 Mar. Car Park 2 – Right off A3050, 1/2 mile west of Hampton Court Bridge, off Graburn Way.

RAIL: Hampton Court Station. 350m to Lock at B on pavements with 4 kerbs up to 100mm, and busy Hurst Road to cross. Train information at www.nationalrail.co.uk or 08457 48 49 50.

BUS: Hampton Court Station as above. Service R68, accessible, to Kew via Richmond. London Buses 020 7222 1234.

Hurst Road stops as shown on map. Services 451 and 461, accessible, to Staines and Kingston via Chertsey and Weybridge. From bus stops 1 to Lock at B - pavement. From bus stops 2 to point A - pavement with 2 kerbs of 100mm and access road with one speed hump. Travel London 020 8258 5600.
