




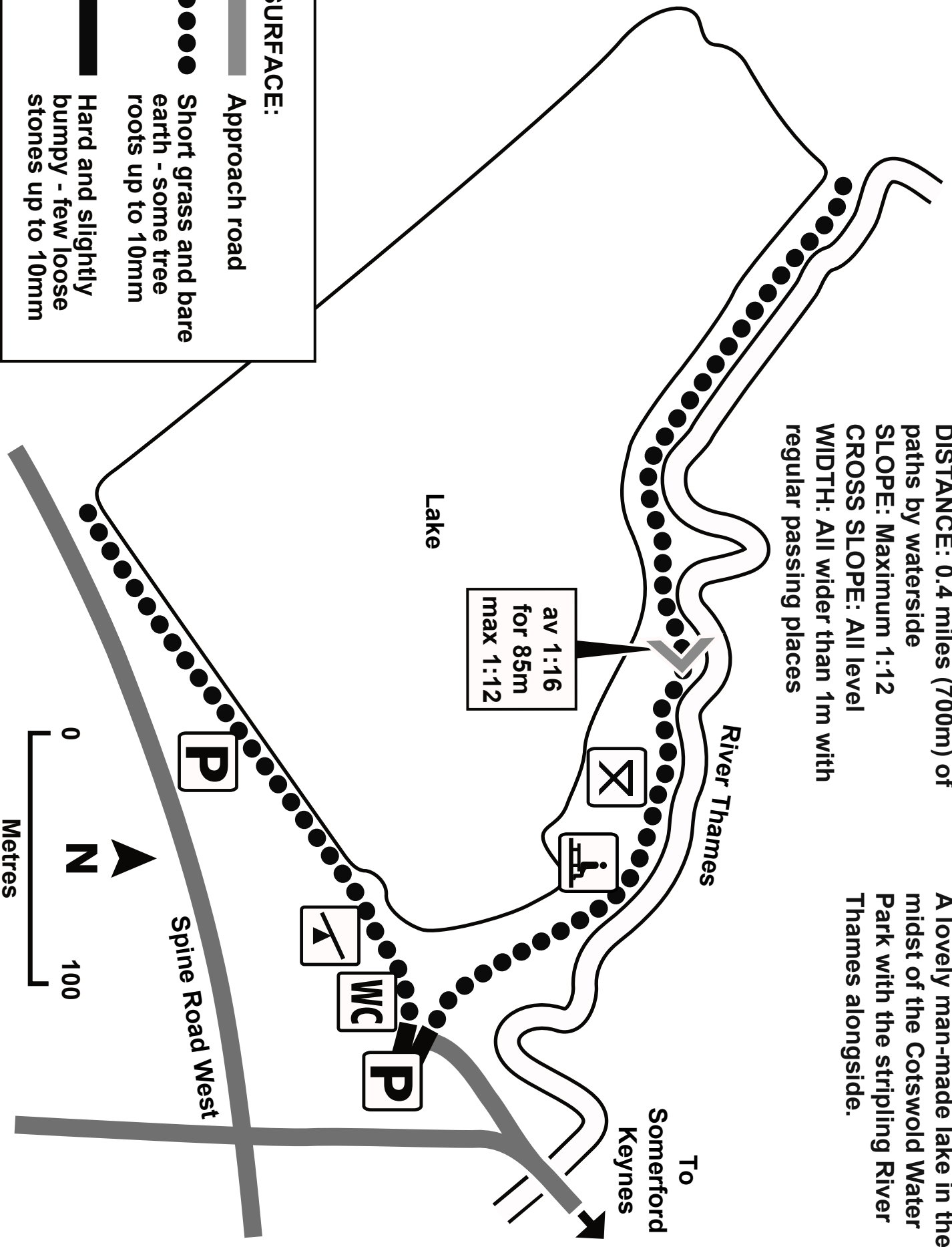
NEIGH BRIDGE COUNTRY PARK

SURFACE:

-  Approach road
-  Short grass and bare earth - some tree roots up to 10mm
-  Hard and slightly bumpy - few loose stones up to 10mm

DISTANCE: 0.4 miles (700m) of paths by waterside
SLOPE: Maximum 1:12
CROSS SLOPE: All level
WIDTH: All wider than 1m with regular passing places

A lovely man-made lake in the midst of the Cotswold Water Park with the stripling River Thames alongside.

HOW TO GET TO NEIGH BRIDGE

MAP: OS Landranger 163, grid ref SU017947

ROAD: Download free map from www.streetmap.co.uk - insert grid ref above as a Landranger and click search. The car park is at Lake 56, north off Spine Road West, 5 miles west off the A419 between Cirencester and Cricklade (B4696 junction).
