Abingdon

Here's a selection to include in your itineraries.

ABINGDON

Abingdon is recognised for special architectural merit with over fifty, 17th century or older buildings. Visit County Hall Museum, one of Abingdon's oldest and most beautiful buildings. Admire St Helen's Church, England's second widest church with 14th century painted ceilings.

A beautiful market town, on the edge of the Cotswolds, close to the Thames. Climb to the top of Folly Tower, built in 1935 by Lord Berners, set within a four-acre woodland to see the breath-taking views over five counties. All Saints' Church has a rich interior with monuments that reveal the intriguing history of Faringdon including the Civil War.

HENLEY ON THAMES

MARLOW

Set in the river valley and alongside the Chiltern Hills, it is a vibrant Georgian market town with a landmark suspension bridge which spans the River Thames. Residents have included: Jerome K. Jerome, T.S. Eliot and Mary Shelley. Follow a 17 mile Midsomer Murders trail.

LONDON AND GREENWICH

The 2,000-year-old river flows through London and provides a stunning backdrop to many of the city's top tourist attractions. Discover London on sightseeing river tours with City Cruises. RICHMOND UPON THAMES

One of London's most attractive boroughs, possessing a timeless charm. Henry VII named Richmond after his favourite Earldom, Richmond in Yorkshire. The borough of Richmond spans both banks of the river here, linking Hampton Court Palace, Richmond Town Centre and Kew Gardens with London.

RUNNYMEDE

The Borough of Runnymede includes Egham and Chertsey and its famous monuments; the most famous commemorates King John sealing the Magna Carta in 1215 and the JFK Memorial to the celebrated president. Along the water meadows, near the National Trust's Magna Carta tea-room and car park, stand The Jurors, twelve intricately worked bronze chairs, representing the jury system, which has its origins in Magna Carta.

WALLINGFORD

There's a wealth of independent shops, antique shops, historical connections and traditional English architecture and it features many times in the Midsomer Murders. With its royal charter, Wallingford hosts plenty of markets. Visit Wallingford Museum, home to the permanent exhibition of Agatha Christie with memorabilia of Agatha and her life in Wallingford.

Take a walk along the 184 miles (294kms) Thames Path National Trail, from the source of the River Thames in the Cotswolds to the sea.

This gentle long-distance walking trail along the banks of the Thames, passes through peaceful water meadows rich in wildlife, unspoilt rural villages and historic towns and cities. Finally, it cuts through the heart of London, passing some of the best-known London landmarks, to finish at the Thames Barrier in Greenwich. Combine a walk with a boat trip back or with a local town or village and attraction, near to the Thames Path. A selection of walks combining rail travel are being developed, these are also suitable for group walks. These include:

Reading to Shiplake (7 miles) - The route of the Thames Path is surprisingly quiet once Reading is left behind, you'll enjoy a landscape of gentle wooded hills and fine houses. Return with **Thames Rivercruise**.

Henley to Marlow (9 miles) - This walk starts and finishes in attractive historic towns, offering plenty to do once you've finished your walk. The path has the backdrop of the Chiltern Hills and you may see a red kite. www.visitthames.co.uk/ThamesValley-GWR

River & Rowing Museum

Not far from Henley is **Stonor Park**, a hidden gem. A family home for over 850 years, with impressive art and treasure collection and Italianate gardens and deer park. In Henley the **River & Rowing** Museum tells the story of the river, rowing and the history of Henley.

Enjoy the gardens of the Thames: Cliveden National Trust's Guided House and Garden Tours. Savill Garden, near Windsor offers a joint package with a Thames cruise with French Brothers.

Don't miss **Windsor Castle or Hampton Court Palace** the jewels in the crown, or explore 1000 years of history and politics with the **Houses of Parliament** audio and guided tours.

Film, TV and Literary Connections

The Thames seems to have inspired murderous thoughts with TV shows such as Morse, its pre-sequel Endeavour and spin off Lewis, Poirot and Midsomer Murders. Christchurch College Oxford is a setting for Harry Potter. Shepperton Studios is only 2 miles from the Thames and the iconic Pinewood Studios home to the legendary 007 stage is only 7 miles away, no wonder the Thames and its towns and villages appear. Authors have been inspired by the Thames: Jerome K Jerome's 'Three Men in a Boat'; Kenneth Grahame 'Wind in the Willow'; E H Shepard found inspiration in this stretch of the River Thames for his illustrations for Grahame's book. Oxford has inspired JRR Tolkien and Philip Pullman to CS Lewis and Lewis Carroll.



COACH PARKING

ABINGDON

It is essential to book as the coach park is locked. Please phone 01235 470118 or switchboard 01235 422422 in advance during weekday office hours. There is a drop off point for one coach at Hales Meadow at Abingdon bridge.

GREENWICH

Pick up/drop off point in Stockwell Street, opposite St Alfege church where there is a waiting time limit of 20 mins. Two coach parking spaces in Park Row car park on Trafalgar Road/Park Row. Free parking for coaches on Charlton Way near Blackheath gate to Greenwich Park and on Norman Road in the town centre.

HENLEY ON THAMES

Spaces for coaches are available at the Henley Station car park. There is a drop-off point at the bus stop in Hart Street close to Barclays Bank. Sat Nav RG9 1AY; 10 Spaces.

MARLOW

There are 2 coach parking bays located in the car park. Parking charges apply 7 days a week (coaches pay triple). Drop off point and parking: Court Garden Car Park, Pound Lane, Marlow SL7 2AE.

READING

Drop off in Central Reading next to Reading Museum on Valpy Street. Coach parking at Reading Buses depot (9am-5pm) by prior arrangement (0118 959 4000).

RUNNYMEDE

Coaches can park at the Runnymede Pleasure Grounds Car Park. Coaches can park for up to one hour for £2. Windsor Road, Egham TW20 OAE.

WALLINGFORD

Coach passenger pick-up/drop-off on the High Street, opposite Wallingford Museum. Coaches can park at Hithercroft Sports Park (OX10 9RB) with permission, except weekends and the Queens Head pub (OX10 8ER) in Crowmarsh by appointment in advance, telephone 01491 839857.

WINDSOR

Windsor Coach Park - charges apply Mon-Sun 9am-6pm (Incl Bank Holidays). Pay and display for coaches only with 74 spaces. Entry is allowed up to 6.30pm, exit at any time. Alma Road, Windsor SL4 3HY.
